1) CALL MEETING TO ORDER/CONFIRMATION OF QUORUM

5) ITEMS OF CONSIDERATION

6) GENERAL PUBLIC INPUT

Citizen Sarah Harris discussed a Special Use Permit requested by Oasis that was approved by the Planning & Zoning Commission on November 29, 2022. Requested that the City Council review and overturn the decision approved by the P&Z Commission.

Citizen David Tiebo, representing the Oasis Stop'n Go spoke about the approved request and the fact that there has not been a formal appeal filed.

City Manager Rothweiler advised the process to go forward.

Discussion ensued on the following:

Council Member Cutler: Asked for clarification on the process.

Council Member Cutler: Asked about the need to go forward.

Mayor Pierce: Explained that they need to decide if they want to move forward and cover the costs associated.

Council Member Brown: What would we be appealing?

City Attorney Nope: Explained that there would be an "adverse impact."

Mayor Pierce: Stated that the Council typically does not override the commission's decisions.

Vice Mayor Reid: Talked about being on the P&Z Commission and that we just need to follow the process.

Council Member Caval: Spoke about appearances that could arise. Strongly advised us not to step in.

The council agreed not to overturn the P&Z Commission's decision as requested.

Mayor Pierce thanked all departments for their efforts in the Christmas Tree Lighting and Parade.

Council Member Caval reported on the Fine Arts Commission meeting.
